JAPANESE CRAFT GIN

Hakuto in Japanese translates to “White Rabbit”, and is also included in legendary folklore in the area of Tottori where the distillery is located. In Japan’s first love story, the White Rabbit of Inaba played matychmaker for King Ookuni and Princess Hachigami. Today you can visit the Hakuto Shrine, which is said to be “holy ground for lovers”. Certainly all gin lovers will appreciate this savory expression. Front and center of this gin is the essence and flavors of the nashi pear, very famous in the Tottori region. The citrus forward aromatics plays well in the overall flavor which combines up to fourteen different fruits and botanicals including juniper berries, coriander seed, yuzu peel, orange peel, Japanese ginger, green tea, cherry blossoms, black pepper and Sansho pepper.

The base is a neutral gain spirit made at the Kurayoshi distillery on the Portuguese Alembic stills and of course using the quality natural spring water filtered through volcanic rocks from Mount Daisen resulting in significant purity and a unique, soft mineral composition.

With an emphasis on the Japanese pear, "Nashi", this draws upon 9 botanicals and the addition of 5 premium botanicals evokes a richer scent. Unique flavors that this provides differentiates itself from your ordinary gin. Please enjoy the spicy yet sweet and refreshing complex flavors.

Hakuto Gin 40%ABV

The Hakuto Gin is robust and flavorful, leading with a blend of yuzu citrus, smoke, pepper, and other aromatics that smells truly distinctive. While juniper doesn't dominate here, the symphony of other aromatics and fragrant finish make this a gin worth discovering in a martini or highball.

Hakuto Premium Gin 47%ABV

The Hakuto Premium Gin is blended with 14 carefully selected botanicals, including orange peel, yuzu peel, gyokuro, sakura or cherry blossom, coriander seeds, juniper, black pepper, and nashi pears - a speciality of Tottori Prefecture. Like its brothers and sisters from the Kurayoshi range, The Hakuto is finished with spring water from Mt. Daisen. The final result is a spicy, sweet yet refreshingly complex Gin that clocks in at an impressive 94 proof and excels in all Gin-forward concoctions.
